To obtain the Mild Intervention license, students must successfully complete the program and pass the ETS Test #5543: Special Education: Core Knowledge and Mild to Moderate Application with a score of 155 or higher or have passing scores on the all the Pearson Tests prior to September 1, 2021. To obtain the Intense Intervention license, students must successfully complete the program and pass the ETS Test #5545: Special Education: Core Knowledge and Sever to Profound Application with a score of 158 or higher or have passing scores on the all the Pearson Tests prior to September 1, 2021.
