## **Substitutions/ Transferred Courses/ Revalidation**

<b>Substitutions/ Transferred Courses /Revalidation</b>			

**Note:** Course substitutions must be approved by the faculty advisor. At the time of degree/licensure completion, course work cannot be over seven years old.

**Revalidation:** Courses over seven years old must be revalidated. Revalidation requires students to demonstrate the current knowledge of course material that was not recently taken. Students will work with their faculty advisor and/or Program Coordinator for an approved revalidation plan.

**\*Courses over ten years old are expired and cannot be used to fulfill the degree/licensure requirements.**

### **ENL License (Indiana)**

## Application Documents (Domestic Students)-All Application documents should be written in English

- **Personal Statement(upload online)- Please use the writing prompts as a guide for your statement.**

Writing prompts:

- Are you an Elementary or Secondary Education licensed teacher in Indiana? If so, what license do you hold?
- What are your personal, academic, and career goals?
- How will this program help you meet your academic and career goals?
- What experiences have prepared you for this program?

This statement should be no more than three double-spaced pages, with a 12-point font.

- **Two Letters of Recommendation(upload online)**

The letters of recommendation must be professional, on letterhead, and signed. Select recommenders who can attest to and describe your character, skillset, experiences, and abilities.

Please note: The application will require you to submit your recommender's email; an email request will automatically be sent to the recommender on your behalf.

- **Transcripts(upload online)**

Submit an unofficial transcript for each institution

- **Proof of License(upload online)**

Please provide a copy of your teaching license

### English Proficiency

- The IU Indianapolis School of Education will accept a TOEFL score of 79 for the Internet-based version exam; the TOEFL cannot be over (2) years old.
