- What experiences have prepared you for this program?

This statement should be no more than three double-spaced pages, with a 12-point font.

• Two Letters of Recommendation (upload online)

The letters of recommendation must be professional, on letterhead, and signed. Select recommenders who can attest to and describe your character, skillset, experiences, and abilities.

Please note: The application will require you to submit your recommender's email; an email request will automatically be sent to the recommender on your behalf.

- Transcripts (upload online)
  - Submit an unofficial transcript for each institution
- Proof of License (upload online)
  - Please provide a copy of your teaching license
