To obtain the Intense Intervention license, students must successfully complete the program and pass the ETS Test #5545: Special Education: Core Knowledge and Severe to Profound Application with a score of 158 or higher or have passing scores on the all the Pearson Tests prior to September 1, 2021. Writing prompts:

- Are you an Elementary or Secondary Education licensed teacher in Indiana? If so, what license do you hold?
- What are your personal, academic, and career goals?
- How will this program help you meet your academic and career goals?
- What experiences have prepared you for this program?
- Are you applying for a licensure in Mild or Intense intervention?

This statement should be no more than three double-spaced pages, with a 12-point font.

• Two Letters of Recommendation(upload online)

The letters of recommendation must be professional, on letterhead, and signed. Select recommenders who can attest to and describe your character, skillset, experiences, and abilities.

Please note: The application will require you to submit your recommender's email; an email request will automatically be sent to the recommender on your behalf.
